

Course module Globalization and Health within the Bachelor Programme in Nursing

In the third semester of the Bachelor programme in Nursing at the Swedish Red Cross University, students attend a course module called *Globalization and Health*. The aim of this module is to describe and explain specific global health challenges at the group- and individual level.

Within *Globalization and Health*, students have as assignment to observe the activities of a non-profit organisation or a community group engaging in health related work, preventing ill health, promoting health or working with vulnerable groups. In order to do this, it is very valuable if the students can get the opportunity to visit your organisation and follow the activities, either for only a day or for a longer period (max 2 weeks). This experience would provide the students with a better knowledge on how such organisations face health challenges and vulnerability within the community.

Based on the observation made during the study visit and the course literature, the students will write a report. In this report, they are expected to reflect upon the organization's activities in relation to specific global health challenges and public health concepts such as empowerment, stigma and vicious circle of poverty.

It is important to note that the study visit and the report does not aim to evaluate the work and the quality of a particular organisation.
